From July 1 through December 31, 2006, the ACS Food Pantry packed and distributed 3,745 bags of free groceries. The total amount of food given was 64,696 pounds. Volunteers provided almost 700 hours of their precious time over the six month period, and as Robert Woodard, our Pantry Coordinator says, "If you were all tired by the end of December, now you know why!" Each month, nearly 200 individuals receive food for themselves and their families. Staff, volunteers and supporters cause the ACS Food Pantry to be an essential part of the way we empower and serve our brothers and sisters living with HIV/AIDS.

AIDS Care Service Educates: Ignorance kills. Knowledge saves. Knowledge of HIV, its methods of transmission, its responses to treatment, has saved millions. So why then are millions still succumbing to this disease? Because our knowledge is not yet complete, and societal and cultural ignorance continue. ACS educates its clients in order that they may protect themselves and others from HIV. ACS educates families in order to dispel fear. ACS provides information to the community so that the impact of HIV/AIDS may be controlled and one day eliminated. For the benefit of everyone, ACS educates.
